

# How does Aeromexico boarding work?

Aeromexico uses boarding groups, which it calls zones, to board flights. Those flying in premium cabins or with elite status move into higher zones. The boarding zones may not be enforced, and customers may simply enter the boarding queue without following the announcements or signs.

Aeroméxico boarding is designed to be organized and efficient, ensuring passengers board the aircraft smoothly and on time. Understanding the boarding process in advance helps travelers know when to line up, what documents are required, and how priority boarding works. Aeroméxico uses a group based boarding system that varies slightly depending on aircraft type, route, and ticket class.
