

● Did this person <b>choose</b> to share this publicly? □

<ul> <li>Would I want the most private moment of my life broadcast for strangers? □</li> </ul>
If your answer is "no" $\ \square$ , the choice is clear: close the tab, don't encourage, don't engage.
We are all shaping online culture together □. Every click, every comment adds to the system.  Instead of fueling exploitation, here's how you can help: □ Don't share, like, or comment on leaked videos □ Report the content□ and the platform hosting it □ Call out harmful behavior when you see it □ □ Show empathy□ to those affected rather than judgment □ Spread awareness about consent and digital safety □
